Short Job Description:

- welcoming and orienting visitors and acquainting them with museum displays
- touring visitors in the shack tent
- -keeping the museum and grounds safe, clean, and tidy
- -promoting raffle sales and museum events like bingo and Heritage Day
- -other tasks as assigned by the manager may include help with photographing, collecting, and entering information about museum artifacts in an online computer database
- -supervision and training provided by the museum manager and volunteers



Qualifications:

The ideal candidate will be a senior high school or university student at least 17 years old with an interest in museums, local history, and Prince Albert National Park. Necessary skills include excellent oral and written communication skills in English, organizational skills, and interpersonal skills. The candidate must be responsible, willing to learn, work both independently and with others and enjoy interacting with the public. If the applicant does not have accommodation in Waskesiu but has a trailer, arrangements may be made to use a seasonal trailer lot.

Waskesiu is a seasonal community within Prince Albert National Park, approximately 100 km north of the city of Prince Albert. In the summer, the townsite fills with tourists and cabin and cottage owners enjoying recreation in the National Park. The Museum preserves the human history of Waskesiu from 1928, the year the Park opened.

Applications will be received until May 22, 2019 but preferred by May 17 if possible
